#### MEETING MINUTES

<u>Call to Order</u> – The meeting was called to order by Committee Chair Elizabeth Flowers at 8:34 a.m.

#### Roll Call

Committee Members Present: Matt Kellogg - yes, Lynn Cullick - here, Elizabeth Flowers - present, John Purcell - here (arrived at 8:36), Matt Prochaska - here. With four members present, a quorum was established to conduct committee business.

Others present: Scott Koeppel, Laura Pawson, Anna Payton- Naperville Area Humane Society, Dee Santucci –Puppy Mill Project, and Jill Edelman – Volunteer Puppy Mill Project

Approval of Agenda – Motion made by Member Cullick to approve the agenda, second by Member Kellogg. With three members in agreement, the motion carried, 4-0.

<u>Approval of Minutes</u> – Member Kellogg made a motion to approve the November 22, 2017 meeting minutes, second by Member Cullick. <u>With four members in agreement, the motion carried 4-0</u>.

<u>Monthly Report</u> – Laura Pawson reviewed the census report with the committee. Written reports provided.

Operations Report - Ms. Pawson stated.

<u>Accounting Report</u> – There was no accounting report for this month. The Committee asked for the report in January to review.

#### **Old Business**

Discussion of the Dog Running at Large Ordinance –Ms. Pawson stated she is continuing to gather information with this. She is reaching out to Commander Peters and will give an update at the next meeting.

#### New Business

Discussion regarding puppy mills and supporting a state proposed measure that would prohibit pet store operators from selling a dog, cat or rabbit acquired from a commercial breeder – Ms. Pawson stated there was some changes to the current Illinois laws regarding commercial breeders. In addition, she stated that a new bill introduced into the Illinois Senate would ban buying of puppies from commercial breeders by pet stores.

Chair Flowers called Ms. Payton to speak on the topic. Ms. Payton stated that the bill will be introduced in the Spring Session, and that it has bipartisan support. She also stated it would cover the Counties of DuPage and Will, and that the City of Chicago has already passed its own ordinance.

Member Purcell made a motion to table the item to another date. With no second, the motion failed.

Ms. Payton encouraged the Committee to sign onto the Illinois bill to cover Kendall County as well.

After further discussion, the Committee thanked the speakers for their time, and agreed to continue the discussion in January.

Member Kellogg left the meeting at 9:00 a.m.

Discussion regarding support of the "Good Samaritan Law" to protect pets left unattended in automobiles – Ms. Pawson stated this was also part of the larger discussion with the puppy mills. It would be to allow a person to enter a vehicle if there was a pet in danger of dying due to heat distress.

The Committee agreed to continue this topic to January as well.

Executive Session – Member Prochaska made the motion to enter Executive Session for:

"The appointment, employment, compensation, discipline, performance, or dismissal of specific employees of the public body or legal counsel for the public body, including hearing testimony

on a complaint lodged against an employee of the public body or against legal counsel for the public body to determine its validity." 5 ILCS 120/2(c)(1)

Member Purcell seconded.

Member Cullick – aye, Member Prochaska – aye, Member Purcell – aye, Chair Flowers – aye. With four members voting aye, the Animal Control Committee entered Executive Session at 9:22 a.m.

At 9:35 am, Member Purcell voted to return to open session. Member Cullick seconded. With four ayes, the meeting returned to open session.

Adjournment – Member Prochaska made a motion to adjourn the meeting, second to the motion by Member Cullick. With all in agreement, the meeting was adjourned at 9:35 a.m.



Check out our website! www.co.kendall.il.us Kendall County Animal Control is the County agency responsible for the enforcement of the state statutes governing rabies control in domestic companion animals. The State of Illinois requires that all dogs be vaccinated against rabies by a licensed veterinarian. Compliance with this law is monitored through the issuance of rabies tags for all dogs residing in the County. All dogs are required to wear their rabies tags when off of the owner's property. If a pet is lost, rabies tags also provide an excellent means of identifying your pet.

Kendall County Animal Control enforces the County's ordinance that prohibits dogs from running at large in unincorporated, residential areas. Animal Control also reports animal bites as well as pick up stray dogs that are in a contained area. Stray dogs may also be brought to the facility during business hours. Dogs and cats are available for adoption at our facility.
