Call to Order and Pledge Allegiance – Chair Matthew Prochaska called the meeting to order at 3:16p.m. and led the Pledge of Allegiance.

With three members present voting aye, a quorum was determined to conduct business.

Others Present: Public Defender Vicki Chuffo, Court Services Director Alice Elliott, Deputy Commander Joe Gillespie, Assistant State’s Attorney Leslie Johnson, County Engineer Fran Klaas, Deputy Commander Jason Langston, Undersheriff Harold Martin, Chief Deputy Mike Peters, Judge Robert Pilmer, Coroner Jacquie Purcell, and Facilities Management Director Jim Smiley

Approval of the Agenda –Member Hendrix made a motion to approve the agenda, second by Member Purcell. **With three members present voting aye, the motion carried by a vote of 3-0.**

Approval of September 10, 2018 Meeting Minutes – Member Hendrix made a motion to approve the meeting minutes from September 10, 2018, second by Member Purcell with the correction of the word “Undersheriff” under Others Present. **With three members present voting to approve the amended minutes, the motion passed.**

Public Comment – None

Status Reports

Coroner –Coroner Jacquie Purcell reviewed the monthly report with the committee, and reported 29 total deaths for October, with 26 natural deaths, and 3 accidental deaths (probable overdoses).

Coroner Purcell reviewed the personnel/office activity with the committee for the month of October including a third meeting at the Kendall County Health Department with local law enforcement agencies, EMS agencies, addiction centers, and HIDTA regarding the impact of the opioid addiction in Kendall County.

Circuit Clerk – Written report provided.

Courthouse – Chief Judge Pilmer stated that they are working with the Administrative Office of the Illinois Courts with respect to Video Interpretation Services, and said that Kendall would be a “test” county for video appearance by litigants for uncontested matters in the next few months. Judge Pilmer will keep the committee updated on the progress of this service.

Court Services – Director Elliott reported that four Probation Officers have been recognized by the Illinois Association for Court Services for Distinguished Service, two supervisors and two line staff.

Additionally they have been working with the Sheriff’s Office on Video Conferencing, and will use it for pre-trial conferencing, expediting the pre-trial process in preparation for court. The department has also been working with the Sheriff’s Office on safety planning and ways to ensure the Probation Officers are safe in the community and also in the building. Ms. Elliott reported Probation Officers are now wearing bullet-proof vests as a result of the planning.

EMA – Written report provided. Director Gillespie reported that they submitted their quarterly grant documentation to the State of Illinois for IEPRA and EMPG grants.

Emergency Siren Testing continued that month as usual.

KenCom – Member Gilmour had nothing to report.

Public Defender – Written report provided. Ms. Chuffo stated that a new Assistant Public Defender was hired and began today.

State’s Attorney – ASA Johnson reported that the office prepared the annual County anti-harassment training for all employees and office/department supervisors. Both training sessions are available on the employee website.

Sheriff’s Report

- a. **Operations Division** – Written report provided. Chief Deputy Mike Peters reported on the “No Shave November” event, where the deputies and employees are raising funds to support one of the dispatchers suffering from Lymphoma.

Deputy Peters also reported that Deputies and other County employees purchased and wore Pink Badges, Pins, T-Shirts, Hoodies and Sweatshirts throughout the month of October in support of Breast Cancer Awareness. The month long sale of items resulted in a donation of \$1500.00 to the Aurora Healthcare Foundation, where 100 percent of the donation benefits the “Pink Possible Campaign” against Breast Cancer.

Peters also reported that there are currently 23 registered child sex offenders, for which they did notices to them advising them they were not allowed to distribute candy to children on

Halloween. As a result of the notifications, the Sheriff's Office was able to produce an arrest for one of the child sex offenders that had an active warrant that extended in a violation of the Sex Offender Registration Act.

Chief Deputy Peters also stated the Sheriff's Office was honored at an annual awards banquet on November 2, 2018 through the Metropolitan Enforcement Directors Task Force Commanders Associations' Annual Awards, which honors dangerous and professional work through hundreds of drug investigations throughout the state. Sheriff's Office personnel recognized were Deputy Harrell, and Inspector Lechowicz.

Deputy Commander Jason Langston reported on a tip received from the National Center for Missing and Exploited Children, an arrest was made stemming from that tip and an investigation, and the U.S. Marshalls Great Lakes Regional Fugitive Task Force took another violent child sex offender into custody on a warrant of failing to register as a violent child sex offender. This is a continuing benefit to having a deputy side of this task force and the benefits that come from that.

Deputy Commander Langston also reported on the first round of Vendor Tobacco Compliance, six of seven vendors were checked, and one business was cited for a petty offense for selling to a minor. This is possible by a grant from the Illinois Department of Human Services, and the Sheriff's Office will continue with checks as the New Year proceeds.

- b. Corrections Division – Written report provided. Undersheriff Martin updated the committee on the Securus tablets and E-messaging system that they have been working toward implementing for inmate use. They hope this will be completed by early 2019.

Undersheriff Martin also reported they had a Fire Safety Inspection on October 9, 2018 by Bristol-Kendall Fire District, and the jail had no violations.

Sheriff Baird reported that with the increased federal inmates, they have increased their anticipated revenue for FY2019, by about \$250,000. Sheriff Baird stated that corrections is on track for that this year, and that they feel comfortable with next year's projected revenue increase.

- c. Records Division – Written report provided.

Undersheriff Martin reported that he will retire on January 4, 2019, and thanked the committee and his co-workers for the time he's been with the County.

New Business - None

Legislative Update – Member Prochaska stated that the General Assembly will be entering veto session soon. Prochaska also reported that United County Council of Illinois (UCCI) has informed Illinois Counties that they are will to pay for a County's NACo annual dues this year. Each County must follow the guidelines for requesting the funds, and payment will be sent.

Adjournment – Member Hendrix made a motion to adjourn the meeting, second by Member Purcell.

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To the Citizens of Kendall County:


The Kendall County Coroner's Office is pleased to release this 2018 Annual Report. The purpose of the report is to enable the Kendall County Board Members and the general public to better acquaint themselves with the activities of our office, as well as to provide an ongoing statistical analysis of past and current deaths in the county to serve as a tool for future planning.

We are diligently working toward accreditation by creating applicable policies and procedures. It has been an eventful year. We have continued to build relationships with our Law Enforcement, Emergency Medical Services, Health Department, and local funeral homes. In recent years, in the state of Illinois, the workload of county Coroners has increased dramatically. This is partly due to changes in society that have made the Coroner's investigative function increasingly important to help resolve conflicts in criminal and civil legal cases, insurance investigations, and other issues. In addition, our office continues to involve itself in community education by speaking to high school classes for driver's education, law enforcement and health careers. We work closely with the courts on customized community service programs. I have also worked to create an Opioid Study Group to manage the multi-disciplinary approaches to the overwhelming opioid crisis. I have facilitated a grief support group specifically for families and friends who have been impacted by an overdose related death. The group is called, "Lights of Hope", and thus far has been very well received. I serve on the Tri-County Elder Abuse Task Force, and I am actively involved with the Illinois Violent Death Reporting Systems.

Our goal is to maintain a high level of quality, professionalism, and integrity in the field of death investigation. We hope that the reader finds the report useful and informative. I would like to thank my investigators and assistants for the time and effort that they have put in at all hours. Without their dedication to the community and their compassion to help families of the deceased, this office could not function efficiently.

I am proud of the work that is produced in our office, and above all I am proud and thankful to serve as the Coroner of Kendall County.

Coroner's Office Personnel

According to the Illinois State Statutes which govern the Coroner's Office, the Coroner and Deputy Coroners are sworn law enforcement officers and are designated by the law as peace officers. In fact, according to IL state statute, the Coroner and Sheriff hold equal powers throughout the county. Our office is comprised of both sworn and non-sworn personnel. Coroner Purcell, Chief Deputy Gotte, and Deputy Knowles are all sworn officers. In addition, we have four coroner's assistants. The assistants are not sworn officers, and as such, do not hold the same powers nor share the same responsibilities as the deputy coroners.

Jacquie Purcell

Kendall County Coroner

Jacquie is the 25th person to be elected as Coroner of Kendall County. She graduated from Worsham College where she studied mortuary science. She is a nationally board certified funeral director and embalmer. She has worked in the death industry since 1994. She started with the Kane County Coroner's Office, moved to the LaSalle County Coroner's Office and has been with the Kendall County Coroner's Office since 2003. Jacquie is a diplomate of the American Board of Medicolegal Death Investigators, and she serves as the District 1 Director of the Illinois Coroners & Medical Examiner's Association.

Jacquie is also a member of the International Association of Coroners & Medical Examiner's Association, the Society of Medicolegal Death Investigators and an affiliate member of the National Association of Medical Examiners.

Levi Gotte

Chief Deputy Coroner

Levi is the only full-time staff member in the coroner's office. His background is extensive in public safety. He has worked as a supervisor for Kendall County's 9-1-1 Center. He is currently appointed as the Deputy Director of Operations with the Kendall County Emergency Management Agency. Levi has completed training with the St. Louis University School of Medicine – Division of Forensic Sciences, Basic Medicolegal Death Investigator Training Program. He is also a fellow member of the International Association of Coroners and Medical Examiners.

Jessica Knowles

Deputy Coroner

Jessica is a part-time Deputy Coroner with the office. She studied at College of DuPage and received her license as Radiologic Technician. She furthered her studies at Weber State University in Utah where she received her license as a Radiological Practitioner Assistant. She currently works full time in the Interventional Radiology department at a local hospital. Jessica completed training with the International Coroner's and Medical Examiner's Association, Basic Medicolegal Death Investigator Training Program. She is also a fellow member of the International Association of Coroners and Medical Examiners.

Scott Shockley

Coroner's Assistant

Scott is a part-time coroner's assistant with the office. His background is extensive in Law Enforcement. He recently retired as a Sergeant after 25 years with the Oswego Police Department. Scott will be attending the Medicolegal Death Investigator Basic Training Course in 2018.

Jennifer Hockings

Coroner's Assistant

Jennifer is a part-time Coroner's Assistant with the office. She has an Associate of Applied Science in Veterinary Technology from Parkland College in Champaign, Illinois. She is currently employed as a Certified Veterinary Technician at a local animal hospital.

Patricia Monarrez

Coroner's Assistant

Patricia (Paty) is a part-time Coroner's Assistant with the office. She recently graduated from Calumet College of St. Joseph with her degree in Criminal Justice with a Forensic Science Concentration. She has worked with several campus security agencies, but she is just beginning her public safety career.

David Jordan

Coroner's Assistant

Dave is a part-time Coroner's Assistant with Kendall County. He is employed full-time as a Lieutenant and Paramedic and part-time as an Assistant Chief of Operations for two local fire protection districts. Dave has over 30 years of experience in the fire service.

Dr. Kristin Escobar Alvarenga

Forensic Pathologist / Coroner's Physician

Kristin Escobar Alvarenga, M.D., is originally from Texas where she received her undergraduate degree from Baylor University and her medical degree from the University of Texas Medical Branch in Galveston, Texas. She then completed her Anatomic and Clinical Pathology Residency at Montefiore Medical Center and the Albert Einstein College of Medicine in Bronx, New York, followed by a one year forensic pathology fellowship training program at the Harris County Institute of Forensic Sciences. Dr. Escobar-Alvarenga works full-time as a medical examiner in Cook County and contracts with Kendall County as a Coroner's Physician.

Reportable Deaths in Kendall County

Kendall County runs on a fiscal year which begins December 1 and ends on November 30. Therefore, the deaths presented in this report occurred during Fiscal Year 2018 which began December 1, 2017 and ended November 30, 2018.

The State of Illinois dictates that the jurisdiction for the coroner is wherever the subject is pronounced dead. This simply means, that if an incident occurs in Kendall County, but that person is transported by any means (personal transport, ambulance, helicopter, etc.) to a hospital or area outside of Kendall County, and is pronounced dead, the Coroner in that county assumes jurisdiction for that death. There are many incidents that begin in Kendall County, but jurisdiction for the coroner is transferred to another county when the subject is pronounced dead outside of the county.

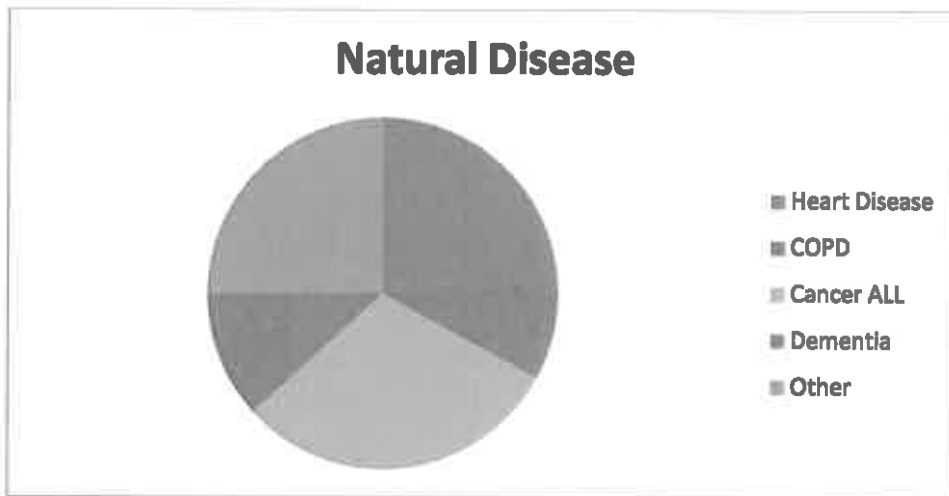
There are 5 manners of death. Each reported death will be examined and assigned a manner and cause of death. The manners are: natural, accidental, suicidal, homicidal or undetermined. Scene Response/Transportation

The Kendall County Coroner's Office responds to many scenes throughout the year. During the investigation, the decision is made whether or not the body should be transported to the Kendall County Coroner's Office for further investigation, transported until next-of-kin can be notified, or released directly to the care of the funeral home. In 2018, the Coroner's staff responded to 67 different calls/scenes and transported 43 bodies to the Kendall County morgue.

BUDGET

The Kendall County Coroner's Office operates on a budget from the general fund. In FY 2018 our entire operating budget was \$174,066. We also generate revenue by charging a \$50 fee for cremation authorizations and various fees for specific reports (autopsy reports, toxicology reports, etc.). In FY 2018, the Kendall County Coroner's Office authorized 194 cremation permits. According to the IL State Statute, these revenues are held in a special fund which can be used to supplement the coroner's office's general operations. In 2018, the Kendall County Coroner's Office received \$8,536.00, in special fees. The coroner's offices throughout the State of Illinois also receive an annual grant. The grant monies are based on a surcharge amount placed on each death certificate issued. Therefore, the grant amount is dependent on the number of death certificates issued, throughout the state, during the previous year. In FY 2018, the Kendall County Coroner's Office received a grant for \$4,477.00. The Kendall County Coroner's Office began working with SUDORS (State Unintentional Drug Overdose Reporting System) which provides a stipend to the office in return for statistical gathering and actively working to reduce opioid deaths within the communities. In 2018, the Kendall County Coroner's Office received a stipend for \$1,479.50. These combined monies are mostly unrestricted and are used to supplement the general budget.

FOIA

Freedom of Information

The Kendall County Coroner's Office receives requests throughout the year for records and information. The majority of information regarding a death is considered public information. The number of requests and responses are represented in the following chart:

ORGAN/TISSUE DONATION

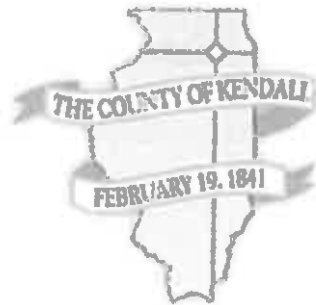

In 2018, the Kendall County Coroner's Office facilitated a number of donations which benefited over one hundred recipients. The gift of donation is special for both the donor and family and recipient. The criterion which needs to be met to even qualify for donation is quite strict, so when a donation is able to be successfully completed – it is truly a gift.

COMMUNITY PROGRAMS

'Carorum Ad Curam', this is a Latin statement you'll notice on many of the items produced from our office. It is a way of offering tribute to the original roots of the Coroner's Office. Originally, the job title, *'custos placitorum coronae'*, was the officer tasked with protecting the property of the Royal Family. From the Latin, *'Corona'*, meaning 'crown' eventually became 'Coroner'. The

function of the office gradually changed, and by the 17th century the main duties were to determine the cause of death in cases not obviously natural. *'Carorum Ad Curam'* translates literally to mean 'to take care of loved ones'. There is no better way to express what we do here in our office. We take care of loved ones – both who have died and those left to mourn.
