Sheriff Baird stated that the software company quoted a cost of \$32,000-\$42,000 for updating the system, but that with his past experience and expertise of the system, Commander Gillespie and another staff member will update the system with the new software. The Sheriff said that although this work will take these two personnel temporarily away from other duties, the issue has been identified and will be rectified with the updated software. The Sheriff will keep the committee updated as needed.


