Operations Report – Laura Pawson reported she is training two new staff. She would like to get quotes to install a fenced-area behind the trailer to create an area for pet introductions and play. Volunteers expressed support for the idea. Funds raised in 2014, 2015 and 2016 from the "Pictures in the Park" volunteer fundraiser would pay for the project.

The Committee and staff had a general discussion about use for walkie-talkies and a third line for the cell phones.

Laura Pawson reported she is gathering data for repetitive complaints of dogs running at large causing property damage and attacking other pets. Often times the dogs return home before impoundment. In such cases, no fines or fees are assessed causing frustration for owners of the injured pet or damaged property.

<u>Accounting Report</u> – Jeff Wilkins provided an overview of the annual financial report with the committee. Through January revenues exceeded expenditures by \$4,847.

Member Prochaska made motion to set the 4th Wednesday of each month at 8:30am as the regular meeting time for the Animal Control Committee, second by Member Purcell. Motion passed unanimously with 5 affirmative votes. The County Board will consider the item for action on March 7.

ORDINANCE 68-1

AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING THE RUNNING AT LARGE OF DOGS IN UNINCORPORATED AREAS SUBDIVIDED FOR RESIDENCE PURPOSES

BE IT ORDAINED by the Board of Supervisors of the County of Kendall that:

Section One: Any person who resides in an unincorporated area of the County of Kendall, which has been subdivided for residence purposes, and who chooses to own or possess a dog, shall at all times keep any such dog, owned or possessed by any such person, securely tied, or securely enclosed on the property occupied by the owner or possessor of any such dog.

Section Two: Any such person described in Section One hereof shall not permit or allow any dog, owned or possessed by any such person to run at large upon the public streets or highways, or upon the properties of other persons in the unincorporated areas of the County of Kendall which have been subdivided for residence purposes.

Section Three: Failure of any person described in Section One hereof to comply with any provisions of this Ordinance shall be deemed a violation of this Ordinance and any such person shall be subject to the fine hereinafter provided.

Section Four: Any person violating any provision of this ordinance shall be fined not less than Ten Dollars (\$10.00) nor more than Fifty Dollars (\$50.00) for each violation or offense.

Section Five: This Ordinance shall take effect upon its passage and publication in accordance with law.

In the bond section the officer should enter or check "NTA" for notice to appear and issue a court date. This is a "Must Appear" offense however no bond is to be taken. The appropriate IUCR code is 9907 (Dog leash law – ordinance)

ARTICLE I. - IN GENERAL

Secs. 10-1-10-20 18. - Reserved.

ARTICLE II. - DOGS

Sec. 10-21 19. - Definitions.

The following words, terms and phrases, when used in this article, shall have the meanings escribed to them in this section, except where the context clearly indicates a different meaning:

"Administrator" means a veterinarian licensed by the state and appointed pursuant to the Illinois Animal Control Act, or in the event a veterinarian cannot be found and appointed pursuant to the Act, a non-veterinarian may serve as administrator under this Act. In the event the administrator is not a veterinarian, the administrator shall defer to the veterinarian regarding all medical decisions.

Animal control act means the Illinois Animal Control Act (510 ILCS 5/1 et seq.).

Animal control warden means any person appointed by the administrator to perform duties as assigned by the administrator to effectuate this article.

"Continuous" means that the noise continues with no interruptions or only unreasonably brief interruptions;

Dog means all members of the family Canidae.

Kennel shall mean any lot or premises, or portion thereof, whether public or private, on which more than five dogs, five cats, or five other household domestic animals over six months of age are kept or on which more than two such animals are maintained, boarded, bred, or cared for in return for remunerations or are kept for the purpose of sale.

Leash means a cord, rope, strap or chain which shall be securely fastened to the collar or harness of a dog and shall be of sufficient strength to keep the dog under control.

Nuisance Dog means a dog which growls, snaps at runs after or chases any person or persons not on the premises of the owner or keeper. A dog that runs after or chases bicycles, motor vehicles, motorcycles, or other vehicles being driven, pulled, or pushed on the streets, highways or public ways. A dog which runs on a roadway causing a traffic hazard, or is involved in a traffic accident. A dog which dissertables, excretes, or causes waste/garbage to be scattered on property other than its owner's, if whether alone or in a pack with other dogs, it threatens, bites, attacks, or prevs on human beings, game animals, domestic animals, or fowl.

Owner means any person having a right of property in an animal, or who keeps or harbors an animal, or who has it in his care, or acts as its custodian, or who knowingly permits a dog to remain on any premises occupied by him or her. "Owner" does not include a feral cat caretaker participating in a trap, spay/neuter, return or release program.

Person means any person, firm, corporation, partnership, society, association or other legal entity, any public or private institution, the state, municipal corporation or political subdivision of the state, or any other business unit.

Pound means any facility approved by the administrator for the purpose of enforcing this article and used as a shelter for seized, stray homeless, abandoned or unwanted dogs.

Stray dog means a dog not on the premises of the owner and not under the control of the owner by leash or other recognized control methods.

Sec. 10-20. - Owner's duties.

Each owner shall provide for each of his animals:

(a) sufficient quantity of good quality, wholesome food and water;

(b) adequate shelter and protection from the weather;

(c) veterinary care when needed to prevent suffering; and

(d) humane care and treatment.

(Ord. No. 2016-???)

Sec. 10-21. - Barking dogs.

- (a) it shall be unlawful for any person in the unincorporated areas of the County of DeKaib that are subdivided for residential purposes, or within 500 feet of such areas of unincorporated county, to own, keep, have in his possession, or harbor any dog which, by frequent or habitual howling, yelping, barking, or otherwise, shall cause annovance or disturbance to any person, provided that the provisions of this section shall not apply to any animal shelter, yeterinary hospital or clinic,
- (b) A person shall not be found to be in violation of this ordinance unless sufficient evidence is presented, which evidence shall include at least one of the following:
 - A complaint made by one person, which is accompanied by audio or video recordings depicting 10 or more minutes of continuous howling, velping, barking or otherwise.
 - 2. Complaints made by two or more persons, residing in different households, regarding the same dog(s) and owner(s), keeper(s) or harborer(s); or
 - 3. A complaint made by one neighbor, but which is corroborated by a responding officer who observes at least 10 minutes of continuous howling, yelping, barking or otherwise.

Sec. 10-22. - Enforcement.

- (a) The administrator may appoint as many deputy administrators and animal control wardens to aid him in enforcing this article as the county board shall authorize.
- (b) Except for rabies inoculation for dogs the compensation of the administrator, deputy administrator or animal control wardens shall be as fixed by the board of health.
- (c) The county board may utilize monies from the general fund to effectuate the provisions of this article.
- (d) The administrator, deputy administrator and animal control wardens in enforcing this article, are clothed with the police powers set forth in section 5 of the Illinois Animal Control Act (510 ILCS 5/5).

(Code 1979, § 4-12; Ord. No. 2007-22, 11-21-07)

Sec. 10-23. - Dogs running at large; apprehension.

- (a) Any dog in the county found running at large contrary to the provisions of the animal control act, or a nuisance dog as defined in this ordinance shall may be apprehended. For this purpose, the administrator shall use any existing or available pound, per 510 ILCS 5/9.
- (b) When a dog has been impounded, the administrator shall cause notice of this event to be given to the owner of the dog, if that person is known. Such notice may be given by telephone, by personal service or by mail to the last known address of the owner. The notice shall advise the owner that redemption of the animal must occur no later than seven business days from the receipt of notice of impoundment of the animal. Testimony of the administrator or his/her authorized agent who mails such notice shall be evidence of the receipt of such notice by the owner of the animal.
- (c) If the owner of any dog which was impounded pursuant to this section desires to redeem the animal, redemption may be completed by doing all of the following:
 - (1) Paying all applicable fees including pickup fees charged by the county and board fees charged by the holding pound and any fees for the treatment of injuries or illness to the animal.
 - (2) Providing satisfactory proof to the administrator that the dog has been inoculated and purchased a rabies inoculation tag. If either inoculation or tag purchase has not been currently accomplished at such time, the dog shall be brought into full compliance with the inoculation and inoculation tag before the dog shall be released.
- (d) Prior to the fulfillment of the seven day holding period, at the discretion of the administrator, animals severely injured, <u>aggressive</u>, or ill may be humanely dispatched.
- (e) Dogs not redeemed by the owner in accordance with the provisions of this article shall be humanely dispatched or offered for adoption as defined under the animal control act.
- f) A person commits a violation of this section when he owns, possesses or harbors a dog which is at large, or is a nuisance as defined in this ordinance. For the purposes of this paragraph, a dog is at large when it is off its custodian's premises and not under his/her control.

LASALLE COUNTY ANIMAL CONTROL DOG AT LARGE ORDINANCE

WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of the residents of the County of LaSalle that provisions be made for the care, protection, and control of animals in the County of LaSalle.

WHEREAS, pursuant to 510 ILCS 5/9 et seq. the Illinois Animal Control Act, the County of LaSalle is authorized to regulate Dogs running at large,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED by the County of LaSalle, acting by and through the LaSalie County Board, as follows:

Section 1: Dogs running at large; apprehension

(a) Any dog in the county found running at large contrary to the provisions of the animal control act shall be apprehended. For this purpose, the administrator shall use any

existing or available pound, per 510 ILCS 5/9.

- (b) When a dog has been impounded, the administrator shall cause notice of this event to be given to the owner of the dog, if that person is known. Such notice may be given by telephone, by personal service or by mail to the last known address of the owner. The notice shall advise the owner that redemption of the animal must occur no later than seven business days from the receipt of notice of impoundment of the animal. Testimony of the administrator or his/her authorized agent who mails such notice shall be evidence of the receipt of such notice by the owner of the animal.
- (c) If the owner of any dog which was impounded pursuant to this section desires to redeem the animal, redemption may be completed by doing all of the following:
 - (1) Paying all applicable fees including pickup fees charged by the county and board fees charged by the holding pound and any fees for the treatment of injuries or illness to the animal. If said dog does not have a readable microchip it shall be microchipped at owner's expense before release.
 - (2) Providing satisfactory proof to the administrator that the dog has been inoculated and purchased a rabies inoculation tag. If either inoculation or tag purchase has not been currently accomplished at such time, the dog shall be brought into full compliance with the inoculation and inoculation tag before the dog shall be released.

(d) Prior to the fulfillment of the seven-day holding period, at the discretion of the administrator, animals severely injured or ill may be humanely dispatched.

- (e) Dogs not redeemed by the owner in accordance with the provisions of this article shall be humanely dispatched or offered for adoption as defined under the animal control act.
- (f) A person commits a violation of this section when he owns, possesses or harbors a dog which is at large. For the purposes of this paragraph, a dog is at large when it is off its custodian's premises and not under his/her control.

Section 3: Violation

Every owner shall comply with provisions of section 1 & 2 of this ordinance. Any person who is found to have violated section 1 or 2 shall pay any fines, impoundment costs, microchip cost, current State of Illinois and facility required vaccinations fees, current rabies vaccinations fees and the current County Registration Fees to the impoundment facility (Veterinary Clinic). All Rabies Registration Ordinance Fines listed penalty fines shall be paid to the Animal Control Office.

1st Offense
2nd and Subsequent Offense

No fine \$150.00

If the above fine is paid to the Animal Control Office within 7 working days, excluding holidays, the fine shall be reduced to \$75.

Section 4: Severability

The invalidity of any section or part of this Ordinance or any rule or regulation promulgated hereunder shall not affect the validity of the remainder of this Ordinance.

Section 5: Prior Ordinances

Any prior Ordinance or Resolution regarding Animal Control licenses and /or fees are hereby repealed to the extent that they conflict with this ordinance.

Section 6: Effective

This Ordinance shall be effective January 1st, 2016.

County still working on 'dogs at-large' law

DeKalb County laws on dogs running at large will serve as a model for similar regulations in La Salle County.

Tuesday morning, the County Board's Public Safety II Committee, which oversees animal control, directed Dr. Dell Brodd, the county animal control administrator, to proceed with a draft ordinance based on the DeKalb County ordinance.

Officials said the law would fit the needs of La Salle County, which now bases enforcement on the state's Animal Control Act.



Brodd, who recommended the use of the DeKalb County ordinance, told committee members he was not comfortable with all the state law's provisions.

"In the Animal Control Act, the second time a non-neutered dog is picked up it's supposed to be neutered — which I think is

overstepping bounds," he said.

The committee has been discussing a dogs-running-at-large ordinance since May, with Brodd repeatedly emphasizing he does not favor a leash law but instead one that places control responsibility on owners.

"I don't expect everyone to have their dog on a leash — as long as they're not causing anyone any trouble," he said. "In the case of a farmer going down the road in his tractor with his dog following him, nobody's got a problem with that — as long as they're behaving themselves."

Last August, the committee gave Brodd the go ahead to draft a La Salle County ordinance on "nuisance" dogs.

At that time, Brodd said enforcement would be aimed at dogs running loose and doing things such as "getting into garbage or defecating in people's vards."

Brodd also recommended dogs would be considered "at-large" if off their property and not under direct supervision and control.

Additionally, Brodd recommended it be considered a violation if a dog is allowed to chase a vehicle.

Not all the previous discussion was revisited Tuesday, but in August, committee members said they did not want the ordinance to cover dogs that are out hunting with their owners and favored Brodd's suggestion that there be no fine for first-time offenses.

Gary Wind, the county's animal control officer, has said before, and repeated Tuesday, the ordinance will allow him to deal with the "frequent flyers" — dogs he is repeatedly called to deal with.

"The one's who aren't taking care of their animals or don't care about their neighbors," he said. "It's for the dogs that keep going next door and chasing kids or going to the bus stop or showing up at schools.

"I waste so much time going back to those same houses."

The revised ordinance is due back to the committee at its December meeting. If acceptable, it will be given a legal review before presentation to the County Board for passage.

DeKalb County's animal control laws

Any dog in the county found running at large contrary to the provisions of the animal control act shall be apprehended. For this purpose, the administrator shall use any existing or available pound, per 510 ILCS 5/9.

When a dog has been impounded, the administrator shall cause notice of this event to be given to the owner of the dog, if that person is known. Such notice may be given by telephone, by personal service or by mail to the last known address of the owner. The notice shall advise the owner that redemption of the animal must occur no later than seven business days from the receipt of notice of impoundment of the animal. Testimony of the administrator or his/her authorized agent who mails such notice shall be evidence of the receipt of such notice by the owner of the animal.

If the owner of any dog which was impounded pursuant to this section desires to redeem the animal, redemption may be completed by doing all of the following:
