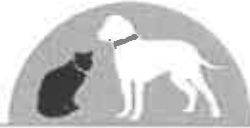

Operations Report – Laura Pawson reported she is training two new staff. She would like to get quotes to install a fenced-area behind the trailer to create an area for pet introductions and play. Volunteers expressed support for the idea. Funds raised in 2014, 2015 and 2016 from the “Pictures in the Park” volunteer fundraiser would pay for the project.

The Committee and staff had a general discussion about use for walkie-talkies and a third line for the cell phones.

Laura Pawson reported she is gathering data for repetitive complaints of dogs running at large causing property damage and attacking other pets. Often times the dogs return home before impoundment. In such cases, no fines or fees are assessed causing frustration for owners of the injured pet or damaged property.

Accounting Report – Jeff Wilkins provided an overview of the annual financial report with the committee. Through January revenues exceeded expenditures by \$4,847.

Operations Report

- ***Discussion on Installing Dog Run behind Trailer (South side)*** – Ms. Pawson reported that she has discussed the construction of a new dog run on the south side of

the trailer with Mr. Smiley in Facilities Management. Ms. Pawson reported that work would be done by using donations that have been collected for three years through the Pictures in the Park fundraiser, the Popcorn Sales fundraiser and the Chastin Pawson Memorial Artwork Sale fundraiser, which total \$4,977.72 combined.

- ***Discuss Dog Running at Large/Nuisance Dog Ordinance*** - Ms. Pawson reported there has been an increase in number of reported dogs running at large/nuisance complaints in the recent months. Ms. Pawson presented the Kendall County ordinance that is dated 1968, as well as the ordinances for DeKalb and LaSalle Counties. Discussion on the need to update the Kendall County ordinance. Ms. Pawson and Jeff Wilkins will provide a proposed ordinance at the April 26, 2017 meeting for review by the committee, prior to full Board approval in May.
- ***New Kennel Manager/Animal Control Officer*** – Ms. Pawson reported that employee Bridget Galazkiewicz has been hired to serve in this capacity.
- ***Discussion on Open House Event*** – Ms. Pawson stated that she is planning to hold an Open House adoption event in late April similar to the “Name Your Own Price” event held last year to encourage adoption of animals at the facility.

Accounting Report – Jeff Wilkins provided an overview of the financial report with the committee, and said that February was a good month for revenues over expenditures.

Old Business – Member Flowers asked that the dates for the meetings be corrected on the County calendar to reflect a meeting each month on the fourth Wednesday.

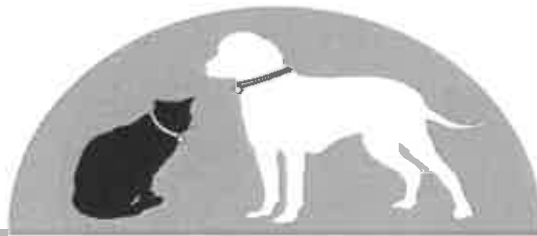

(510 ILCS 5/3) (from Ch. 8, par. 353)

Sec. 3. The County Board Chairman with the consent of the County Board shall appoint an Administrator. Appointments shall be made as necessary to keep this position filled at all times. The Administrator may appoint as many Deputy Administrators and Animal Control Wardens to aid him or her as authorized by the Board. The compensation for the Administrator, Deputy Administrators, and Animal Control Wardens shall be fixed by the Board. The Administrator may be removed from office by the County Board Chairman, with the consent of the County Board.

The Board shall provide necessary personnel, training, equipment, supplies, and facilities, and shall operate pounds or contract for their operation as necessary to effectuate the program. The Board may enter into contracts or agreements with persons to assist in the operation of the program and may establish a county animal population control program.

The Board shall be empowered to utilize monies from their General Corporate Fund to effectuate the intent of this Act.

The Board is authorized by ordinance to require the registration and may require microchipping of dogs and cats. The Board shall impose an individual dog or cat registration fee with a minimum differential of \$10 for intact dogs or cats. Ten dollars of the differential shall be placed either in a county animal population control fund or in the State's Pet Population Control Fund. If the money is placed in the county animal population control fund it shall be used to (i) spay, neuter, or sterilize adopted dogs or cats or (ii) spay or neuter dogs or cats owned by low income county residents who are eligible for the Food Stamp Program. All persons selling dogs or cats or keeping registries of dogs or cats shall cooperate and provide information to the Administrator as required by Board ordinance, including sales, number of litters, and ownership of dogs and cats. If microchips are required, the microchip number may serve as the county animal control registration number.

In obtaining information required to implement this Act, the Department shall have power to subpoena and bring before it any person in this State and to take testimony either orally or by deposition, or both, with the same fees and mileage and in the same manner as prescribed by law for civil cases in courts of this State.

The Director shall have power to administer oaths to witnesses at any hearing which the Department is authorized by law to conduct, and any other oaths required or authorized in any Act administered by the Department.

This Section does not apply to feral cats.

(510 ILCS 5/4) (from Ch. 8, par. 354)

Sec. 4.

When the Boards of 2 or more counties, through mutual agreement, wish to join to effectuate any part or all of this Act, they shall make written request to the Director, setting forth the geographical area and the Sections of this Act involved. Whenever, as ascertained from investigation, hearing, or otherwise, the Director determines it is advisable that these counties form a District, he may designate and establish such District. A District Board shall be formed and shall effectuate this Act as set forth for an individual county.

(510 ILCS 5/7.1) (from Ch. 8, par. 357.1)
Sec. 7.1. In addition to any other fees provided for under this Act, any county may charge a reasonable fee for the pickup and disposal of dead animals from private for-profit animal hospitals. This fee shall be sufficient to cover the costs of pickup and delivery and shall be deposited in the county's animal control fund. (Source: P.A. 93-548, eff. 8-19-03.)

(510 ILCS 5/8) (from Ch. 8, par. 358)
Sec. 8. Rabies inoculation. Every owner of a dog 4 months or more of age shall have each dog inoculated against rabies by a licensed veterinarian. Every dog shall have a second rabies vaccination within one year of the first. Terms of subsequent vaccine administration and duration of immunity must be in compliance with USDA licenses of vaccines used. A veterinarian immunizing a dog, cat, or ferret against rabies shall provide the Administrator of the county in which the dog, cat, or ferret resides with a certificate of immunization. Evidence of such rabies inoculation shall be entered on a certificate the form of which shall be approved by the Board and which shall contain the microchip number of the dog, cat, or ferret if it has one and which shall be signed by the licensed veterinarian administering the vaccine. Only one dog, cat, or ferret shall be included on each certificate. Veterinarians who inoculate a dog shall procure from the County Animal Control in the county where their office is located serially numbered tags, one to be issued with each inoculation certificate. The Board shall cause a rabies inoculation tag to be issued, at a fee established by the Board for each dog inoculated against rabies.

Rabies vaccine for use on animals shall be sold or distributed only to and used only by licensed veterinarians. Such rabies vaccine shall be licensed by the United States Department of Agriculture.

If a licensed veterinarian determines in writing that a rabies inoculation would compromise an animal's health, then the animal shall be exempt from the rabies inoculation requirement, however, the owner is still responsible for the tag fees.

If a bite occurs from an exempt animal, the exempt animal shall be treated as an unvaccinated animal. If the animal is exempt, the animal shall be re-examined by a licensed veterinarian on no less than an annual basis and be vaccinated against rabies as soon as the animal's health permits. (510 ILCS 5/9) (from Ch. 8, par. 359)
Sec. 9. Any dog found running at large contrary to provisions of this Act may be apprehended and impounded. For this purpose, the Administrator shall utilize any existing or available animal control facility or licensed animal shelter. The dog's owner shall pay a \$25 public safety fine, \$20 of which shall be deposited into the Pet Population Control Fund and \$5 of which shall be retained by the county or municipality. A dog found running at large contrary to the provisions of this Act a second or subsequent time must be

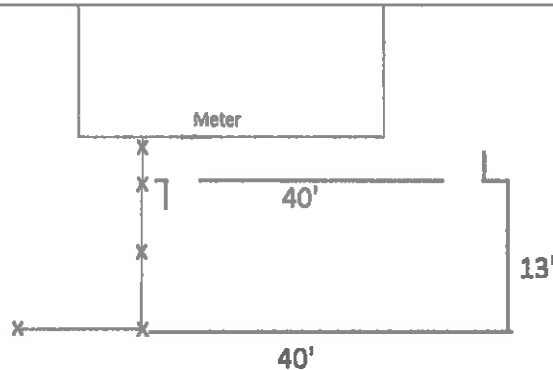

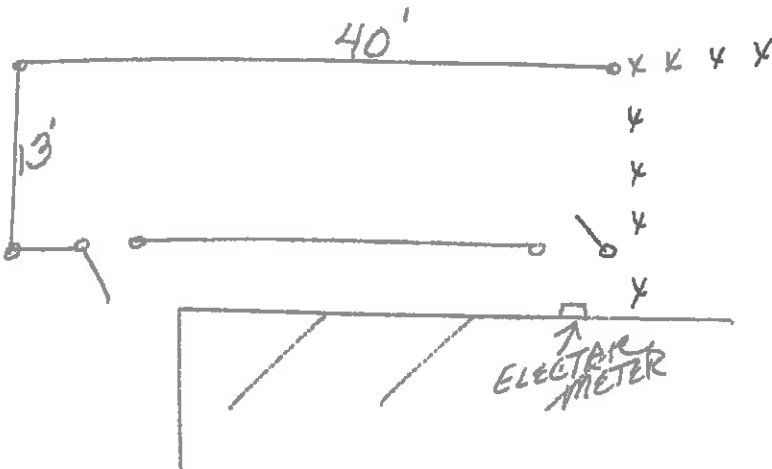
