Wednesday, January 27, 2016 Meeting Minutes

Call to Order

The Judicial Legislative Committee was called to order by Committee Chair Matthew Prochaska at 3:01p.m.

Roll Call

Committee Members Present: Judy Gilmour - here, John Purcell – yes, Bob Davidson - yes, Matthew Prochaska - here, Dan Koukol - yes

Others Present: Sheriff Dwight Baird, Vicki Chuffo, Robyn Ingemunson, Judge Tim McCann, Judge Robert Pilmer, Tina Varney, Eric Weis, Jeff Wilkins

<u>Approval of Agenda</u> – Member Gilmour made a motion to approve the agenda, second by Member Davidson. <u>With all in agreement, the motion carried.</u>

<u>Approval of Minutes</u> – Member Koukol made a motion to approve the November 30, 2015 minutes, second by Member Davidson. <u>Minutes adopted with all in agreement</u>.

Status Reports

<u>Circuit Clerk</u> – Robyn Ingemunson distributed the annual case filings report, which also showed a comparison for the last 5 years. Ms. Ingemunson said that the report shows a slight decrease in case filings each year. Judge McCann said that the decrease in case filings are lower nation-wide, partly due to the increased use of arbitration and mediation, and other means available outside the court system.

<u>Courthouse</u> – Judge McCann updated the committee on the Yorkville Art Guild mural project planned for the courthouse. Judge McCann said the design is in the final stages, and should be ready in the spring.

Judge McCann reported that half of the judges will be attending the Bi-Annual education conference. Judge McCann reported that half of the judges go in February and half go in April.

<u>Court Services/Probation</u> – Tina Varney reviewed the monthly juvenile detention and board & care reports with the committee. Ms. Varney reported that they continue to receive the probation salary reimbursements from AOIC for state fiscal year 2016, and have received July and August, and most of September already. The only issue is that they are getting reimbursements based on last year's salaries due to the state budget crisis.

Ms. Varney reported that in the first 9-months of their pre-trial program they have done 468 bond reports and have supervised 153 people on trial supervision, and currently have 110. She said there have been very few violations, and the program is going well.

<u>Public Defender</u> – Vicky Chuffo distributed the monthly report and stated that there has been an increase in felony and misdemeanor appointments for the last month.

<u>Sheriff's Office/Court Security</u> – Sheriff Baird reported that there was an alleged escape attempted by an inmate appearing in court yesterday. Sheriff Baird was happy to report the inmate was subdued and taken to a holding area without any further disruption to the courtroom or with courthouse operation.

State's Attorney - No report

<u>Legislative Report and Update</u> – Member Prochaska reviewed the summary of the final report to the Governor's on the task force for local government consolidation and unfunded mandates. Member Prochaska stated the full report is over 100 pages long.

Member Prochaska also informed the committee that UCCI will be doing their annual salary survey of all positions, and said UCCI provided a list of the positions they are seeking information on.

Member Prochaska also provided information on the UCCI Legislative Reception on February 16-17, 2016 in Springfield. He said the education conference on the 17th will include a section on parliamentary procedure and budgeting in a tough economy.

Member Prochaska also briefed the committee on the Metro West policy positions for 2016, and the legislative status report for different bills that are currently before the General Assembly.

New Business

A Resolution Caking for Equitable Solution to Issues Related to Increased Juror Compensation – Discussion on the proposed resolution, the purpose for the resolution on juror fees, and authorizing UCCI to file an Amicus Brief for Kendall County.

Member Prochaska briefed the committee on the Cook County case and said if the Supreme Court upholds the Cook County case, they are hoping that they will also rule the juror fees as unconstitutional as well.

Judge McCann said that this was paraded that this was going to be revenue neutral because it would reduce the number of jurors, but increase the rate of pay. Judge McCann said that this was never going to be revenue neutral.

Member Prochaska briefed the committee on the Kakos v. Butler case, in which the Cook County judge stated that six member juries for civil trial are unconstitutional in the State of Illinois, and because they ruled the state statute unconstitutional, it gets an automatic appeal to the state Supreme Court, and UCCI is asking the member counties if they can file an amicus brief saying that in UCCI's opinion because of how the legislation was drafted, that the judicial fees are linked to the number of civil jurors.

Member Prochaska made a motion to table the resolution to a future meeting, second by Member Davidson. With four members voting aye, and one member voting nay, the motion carried.

SYNOPSIS

Creates the Local Government Inspector General Act. The purpose of the Act is to establish an independent entity to which allegations of incompetence, neglect of duty, malfeasance in office, corruption, or official misconduct involving units of local government, including their officers, employees, and agents, or elected or appointed local officials may be reported and investigated with the assistance of the Attorney General. Creates the Local Government Ethics Commission and the Office of the Local Government Inspector General and provides that members of the Commission and the Inspector General shall be appointed by the Governor with the advice and consent of the Senate. Sets forth the procedures of investigating a complaint and the issuing of reports. Defines terms.

Short Description: Revoked FOID Card Seizure

Sponsor(s): Julie Morrison (D-Deerfield)

Status: Senate Judiciary Committee (Postponed)

SYNOPSIS

Amends the Firearm Owners Identification Card Act. Provides that if the Department of State Police has not received the Firearm Disposition Record within 5 business days after sending notice of revocation and seizure of an FOID card, the Department must send a second notice to the sheriff and law enforcement agency where the person resides. The second notice shall include the compliance requirements under the Act. Upon receiving the second notice, the sheriff or law enforcement agency shall report to the Department the status and efforts pursued regarding compliance under the Act. If the person whose FOID card has been revoked fails to comply with the requirements of the Act, the sheriff or law enforcement agency where the person resides shall (rather than may) petition the court for a warrant to search for and seize the person's FOID card and firearms. Provides that within 30 days after the effective date of the amendatory Act, and by January 31 of each year thereafter, the Department of State Police shall provide written notice of the requirements of this provision to every sheriff and law enforcement agency within the State. Effective immediately.

SYNOPSIS

Amends the Election Code to provide for the recall of local elected officials. In addition to state officials, includes county board members, local mayors, aldermen and school board officials. The Judiciary would be exempt due to constitutional protections.

NOTE: The measure would require a three-fifths vote in both the House and Senate before being put to referendum on the 2016 ballot.

SYNOPSIS

Denise Winfrey

Amends the Counties Code and the Illinois Municipal Code. Provides that a sheriff's office or police department may not request or receive specified equipment or vehicles from military equipment surplus programs. Further provides that, if a sheriff's office or a police department requests property from a military equipment surplus program, then the sheriff's office or police department shall publish notice of the request on a publicly accessible website within 14 days after the request. Effective immediately.

Creates the Local Government Travel Expense Control Act. Provides that school districts and non-home rule units of local government shall, by resolution or ordinance, regulate travel, meal, and lodging expenses of officers and employees including: (1) the types of official business for which travel, meal, and lodging expenses are allowable; (2) maximum allowable reimbursement for travel, meal, and lodging expenses; and (3) a standardized form for submission of travel, meal, and lodging expenses. Provides that all travel, meal, and lodging expenses may only be approved after specified documentation has been submitted and the expenses are approved by a roll call vote. Prohibits reimbursing entertainment expenses.

Short Description: Labor Agreement Hearings

Sponsor(s): Jeanne Ives (R-Wheaton)

Status: House Rules Committee

SYNOPSIS

Amends the Illinois Public Labor Relations Act and the Illinois Educational Labor Relations Act. Provides that, once an agreement is reached between a public or educational employer and its employees regarding all of the terms of a collective bargaining agreement, the agreement shall be reduced to writing and published on the website of the public or educational employer. Requires the public or educational employer, not less than 14 days after publishing such an agreement, to hold an open public meeting on the ratification of that agreement. Provides that any contract between a public employer and an employee where the total compensation exceeds \$150,000 shall be published on the employer's website for a period of not less than 14 days prior to being signed by both the employer and the employee. Requires the public employer to hold an open public meeting on the contract in addition to posting it for 14 days if that contract is subject to board approval. Makes conforming changes in the Open Meetings Act and the Freedom of Information Act. Effective immediately.

Short Description: Local Government Dissolution / Township Consolidation

NOTE: Discussion only on proposals to allow for local government reduction. This list is not all inclusive.

SB 2287 (Althoff) - Township Singular Dissolution

Amends the Township Code. Provides that upon a petition by citizens, a referendum shall be submitted to the voters to discontinue and abolish that township's township organization and to transfer all the rights, powers, duties, assets, property, liabilities, obligations, and responsibilities of the township organization to the county. Provides that the township officers of any township that is discontinued shall continue as officers of that township until the expiration of the respective terms for which they were elected or appointed. Further provides that a county may retain its form of government after all townships have been dissolved. Amends the Property Tax Code, the Public Health District Act, the Illinois Public Aid Code, and the Illinois Highway Code making conforming changes. Effective immediately.

SB 2288 (Althoff) - Discontinue Township

Amends the Townships Code. Removes the requirement that a township must be located within a county with a population of 3 million or more and that it must contain a territory of 7 square miles or more in order to discontinue and abolish a township organization within a coterminous municipality in which the city council exercises the powers and duties of the township board. Effective immediately.

SB 2289 (Althoff) - Township Consolidation / Limits Revenue

Amends the Township Code. Removes a restriction requiring townships to possess an equalized assessed valuation of not less than \$10,000,000 or 126 square miles. Further provides that after a vote or ordinance has approved the consolidation of a township, a county board may establish a new tax for the consolidated township or consolidated township and municipality. Amends the Property Tax Code making conforming changes.

SB 2412 (Althoff) - Discontinue Township

Amends the Townships Code. Provides that all townships within a coterminous municipality may discontinue and become part of the municipality.

SB 2462 (Duffy) / HB 4968 (Demmer) - Discontinue Township

Amends the Township Code. Provides that all townships within a conterminous, or substantially conterminous, municipality may be consolidated.

SB 2464 (Connelly) / HB 4967 (McSweeney) - Local Government Dissolution

Creates the Citizens Empowerment Act. Provides that electors may petition for a referendum at the next general election to dissolve a unit of local government. Sets forth the requirements for the petition, together with the form and requirements for the ballot referendum. Provides for the transfer of all real and personal property, and any other assets, together with all personnel, contractual obligations, and liabilities of the dissolving unit of local government to the receiving unit of local government. Amends the Election Code to provide exceptions for the Local Government Dissolution Act.

SB 2470 (Duffy) / HB 4980 (Franks) - Township Consolidation / Dissolve Township Assessor

Amends the Township Code. Removes a restriction limiting townships to 126 square miles. Provides that a township plan for altering the boundaries of townships shall require a new property tax rate to be levied on the affected townships after the boundaries are altered. Provides that a county board may by resolution initiate a referendum to discontinue all townships in a county (currently, a referendum can only be initiated by citizen petition). Provides that a county board may elect to restructure into a commission form of government after discontinuance of township organization (currently, a county is required reorganize into a commission form of government). Further provides that the county board or the voters of a township may dissolve all offices of township assessor and multi-township assessor in specified counties with the county assessor or supervisor of assessments replacing each township assessor or multi-township assessor. Amends the Illinois Highway Code. Provides that a township road district, with roads of less than a total of 25 miles in length, may be abolished by the township board of trustees or by public referendum. Amends the Property Tax Code, the Counties Code, and the Public Health District Act making conforming changes.
