#### **Consent Agenda**

#### D. Construction Change Order #6

The Finance Committee reviewed the proposed Change Order #6 for D. Construction.

Approval of the change order will generate a \$49,500.00 contract savings from reducing the footprint for final grading and turf seeding.

Change Order #6 will support completion of an expanded dumpster enclosure pad and fencing to accommodate a recycling bin and a 15' X 15' hilltop overlook concrete pad which will accommodate a future shade structure (Eagle Scout project).

A portion of the contract savings will be applied to bring the project back into budget, while affording the following improvements:

- 1. Forest Preserve Standard Entry Sign
- 2. Bar Gate at Entry
- 3. Electrical to Shelter, Shop and Water Pump Repair (final cost TBD)
- 4. In-House Site Restoration Project (Approx. \$19,500).

The change order concept has been approved by the IDNR.

#### **New Business**

#### ICECF Land Acquisition Proposal

The Conservation Foundation has entered into purchase contracts for the fee-simple purchase of two Reservation Woods Parcels totaling 10.2-acres. The District is eligible to apply for an illinois Clean Energy Community Foundation Land Acquisition grant which, if awarded, will cover up to 80% of the land purchase costs. The Conservation Foundation has informed the District of their intention to donate 20% of the purchase cost (up to \$34,435.00) for the two parcels to the District at closing, which covers the District's required grant match. The grant also provides up to \$10,000 towards initial restoration efforts, with additional funds requested to potentially acquire a third parcel to connect the District's Reservation Woods holdings to Henneberry Forest Preserve.

#### ICECF K-12 Pollinator Schools Grant

District staff recommends approval of the submission of an Illinois Clean Energy Community Foundation K-12 Pollinator Schools Grant application to continue efforts to enhance prairie areas within the District's preserves with support from K-12 students and community volunteers. The grant provides \$11,000.00, with a required District match of \$1,111.00.

#### ICECF Pollinator Meadows Pilot Program Proposal

The District has been invited to participate in the Illinois Clean Energy Community Foundation's Pollinator Meadows Pilot Program which aims to convert existing turf grass areas to pollinator-friendly habitat. Hoover Forest Preserve, Harris Forest Preserve, Little Rock Creek Forest Preserve, and Jay Woods Forest Preserve have areas currently in turf grass that can be converted to prairie meadow and expand existing habitat areas without impacting recreational uses. The grant provides up to \$20,000.00 in funding for conversion projects (minimum 2-acres collectively) with a required 1:1 match from the District.

#### Other Items of Business

#### Millbrook Bridge Removal

D. Construction has confirmed that the Millbrook Bridge Removal Project will commence on August 17, 2020. The District will be closing its Shuh-Shuh-Gah Canoe Launch area from August 17, 2020 until the removal is completed this fall.

#### ComEd Green Region Grant Award

The District is working to review specifications and secure quotes for the purchase of \$10,000.00 of dry mesic woodland-edge seed mix for Fox River Bluffs and Hoover Forest Preserves to support Rusty Patched Bumble Bee recovery.

#### Henneberry Woods Connected Parcel Assignment

The District has been working with the Kendall County Assessor's Office and Kendall County GIS departments to trace the parcel history of Lot 11 in the Davis Subdivision adjacent and conterminous with Henneberry Forest Preserve. The Assessor's Office reports that County land records indicate the Lot 11 parcel is connected to a parent parcel purchased by the District.

The Assessor's Office and District staff recommend State's Attorney's Office review of the records to help guide the District's petition to claim the parcel.




Figure 1: Davis Subdivision - Lot 11 Parcel

The Foundation expects the award process will be competitive and some projects may be declined. The Foundation will seek a statewide geographic distribution of funds for the first round of grants awarded under this pilot.


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
