EMA/Search and Rescue Report

MARCH 2021

COVID

- KCEMA continue to participate as volunteers for the Mass Vaccination clinics – 385 hours in the 1st quarter of 2021
- Suppling gloves and a vaccine freezer to KCHD and gloves to Corrections
- Weekly COVID SitRep published to local government entities.

Outreach/EAS

- Required weekly and monthly testing of IPAWS, NARS, StarCom have been completed
- Amateur Radio storm spotter group has been assembled for the spring severe weather season.
- KCEMA is planning to set up a Local Emergency Planning Committee (LEPC). This committee will develop a HAZMAT emergency response plan, review the plan at least annually, and provide information about chemicals in the community to citizens. So far we have cataloged all Level II hazardous chemicals that have been reported to KCEMA (for 2021) as well as 4 small reported spills (2020). More to come on the LEPC.

Unified Command Post (UCP) Vehicle Updates

- In the process of installing ILEAS supplied equipment for new functionality and upgrades: radios, computer networking, etc.

Search and Rescue

- March 5- Missing person K9 and ground search for a 27 YOA male that has been missing since December 27, 2020 in Byron. Three (3) Kendall County EMA SAR personnel participated in this search along with forty-five (45) others from surrounding agencies. The man was not found during the search but was found deceased a few days later 40 miles downriver.
- March 13- Multi agency Search and Rescue training was held at the Joliet Army Training Center in Elwood, IL. The subject was Daytime Search Techniques (Mock Search). MOC1 Command Post was brought in by Naperville EMA for Search Management. Fifty-one (51) Search and Rescue professionals from ten (10) agencies were in attendance. Four (4) Kendall County EMA SAR Search and Rescue personnel participated in the training.
- March 16 - Instructor Update for Basic Navigation and Ground Search and Rescue through Illinois Search and Rescue Council. Two (2) Kendall County EMA SAR personnel participated in this instructional update.

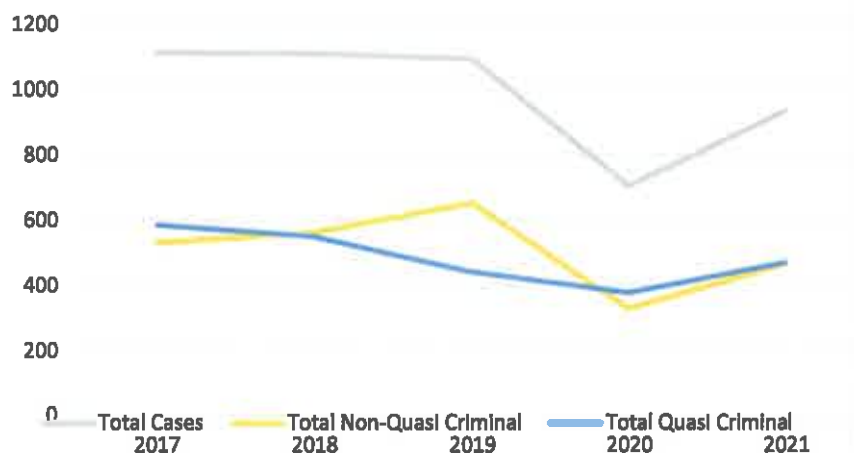

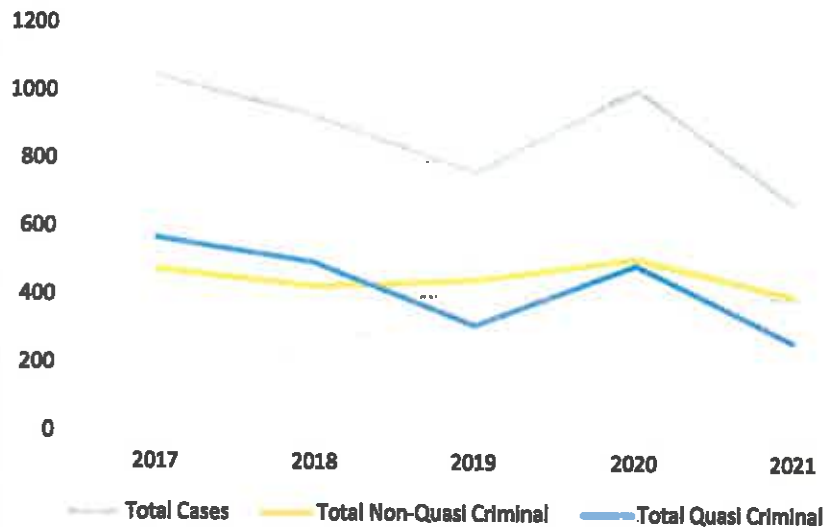

Items Worthy of notice to the County Board:

The Probation and Sheriff Departments have completed the transfer of the GPS Program. The GPS officer has been reassigned to work specifically with Sex Offenders and high risk Domestic Violence cases. Supervising specialized populations requires specialized training and extensive collaboration with law enforcement, treatment providers and victim advocates. This past month the officer and his supervisor participated with local law enforcement officers during a county wide "Knock and Talk" event for Sex Offenders. This collaboration proved fruitful and provided the probation department an opportunity to gather information that will aid in supervision and behavioral change that we would not have otherwise had. It is anticipated we will collaborate on this again in the future.

The Administrative Office of Illinois Courts is revamping data collection for all probation, pretrial and problem solving courts throughout the state that is anticipated to be completed in July. The Go Live date for the new data set is January 1, 2022. This has been long anticipated as statistical information provided to the state had not been updated since 1990. Whereas we currently provide limited useful data to the state, we are now being asked to provide a significant amount more. Although some is data we already collect but wasn't included in our reports, much is new. This does require updates to our processes and case management system. AOIC will pay for the costs of integration of our system with theirs but not the cost to modify our specific system. An estimation of cost has been requested from our provider but is unavailable until all three of the data sets are available. The cost of the development of the upgrade will be split amongst the various counties that utilize our case management system. We will attempt to split the cost over two fiscal years if possible. I will keep you posted in the event it will exceed our current budgeted amount.

The union contract with the probation officers will expire on 11-30-21. We anticipate negotiations on a new contract to begin within the next couple of months.

This week's Illinois State Association of Counties (ISACo) "News and Views" e-newsletter provides an update on Congressional work concerning the American Rescue Plan Act and the proposed provision to grant direct and flexible federal funding to counties, reports on ISACo's most recent efforts to protect counties by opposing a proposed cut to state-shared income tax revenue, conveys what occurred with select legislation of interest to counties considered in Illinois House and Senate committee hearings last week (March 1-5), spotlights key legislation about which county officials should be aware, reminds county officials to register for the National Association of Counties (NACo) Virtual Legislative Conference that begins today, includes information about two NACo National Membership calls scheduled for this week, highlights ISACo corporate partner Comcast and invites counties to join ISACo.

U.S. Senate Approves Package with Federal Funding for Counties

The U.S. Senate approved its version of the *American Rescue Plan Act* on March 6.

The Senate version of the plan includes \$65.1 billion in direct, flexible funding for counties. This is the same amount the House allocated for counties in its version of the plan. For Illinois, this would mean an allocation for counties of \$2.5 billion. An earlier version of the Senate bill would have reduced the overall county allocation by \$5 billion, but the \$5 billion was added back just prior to Senate passage thanks in large part to NACo's strong advocacy on behalf of counties.

ISACo was in communication with Illinois' Congressional delegation to encourage support for the county funding.

With different versions having passed the House and Senate, the chambers will work to reconcile the differences before sending a final version to President Biden.

Proposed LGDF Reduction to Local Governments

Decennial Committees on Local Government Consolidation and Efficiency Act (No Position)

HB 162 (Representative Keicher, R-Sycamore) would create the Decennial Committees on Local Government Consolidation and Efficiency Act. The bill would require local governments to, within one year of the effective date and every 10 years thereafter, form a committee to explore governance and consolidation issues. The bill **exempts counties and municipalities**, but does require county board chairs/presidents in the county within which the local government lies to appoint at least two residents of the governmental unit to the committee as well as a government studies representative from a State university or community college. The committee is required to prepare a report of its findings before dissolving. **The bill was approved by the House Counties and Townships Committee and an amendment is expected at a later date.**

RESOLUTION NO. ____ - ____

A RESOLUTION CALLING FOR THE GOVERNOR AND GENERAL ASSEMBLY TO PROTECT LOCAL CONTROL OF ZONING AND LAND USE

WHEREAS, Counties are authorized by the Counties Code (55 ILCS 5/1-1001 *et seq.*) to adopt and develop zoning regulations; and

WHEREAS, Section 5-12001 of the Counties Code provides “the county board of each county, shall have “the power to regulate and restrict the location and use of buildings, structures and land” and “to regulate and restrict the intensity of such uses, to establish building or setback lines on or along any street, trafficway, drive, parkway or storm or floodwater runoff channel or basin outside the limits of cities, villages and incorporated towns which have in effect municipal zoning ordinances” (55 ILCS 5/5-12001); and

WHEREAS, consistent with their zoning authority, numerous Counties throughout the state of Illinois have adopted zoning and setback regulations related to wind energy facilities such as the model ordinance prepared by the Chicago Environmental Law Clinic and have made substantial revisions over time to suit the needs of their Counties and the residents of their Counties; and

WHEREAS, Senate Bill 1602 was filed in the Illinois Senate on February 26, 2021 and seeks to mandate very specific timelines and procedural requirements regarding siting approval or a special use permit for commercial wind energy facilities, requiring at least one public hearing not more than 45 days after the filing of the application for siting approval or a special use permit for a wind energy facility; and

WHEREAS, Senate Bill 1602 also mandates substantive changes including setback requirements, blade tip height limitations, and sound limitations; and

WHEREAS, Senate Bill 1602 requires that any currently-existing county zoning ordinances pertaining to wind farms be amended within 120 days to comply with the requirements of the bill and prohibits a county from adopting any future restrictions on the installation or use of a commercial wind energy facility that are inconsistent with the provisions of the bill; and

WHEREAS, the changes contained in Senate Bill 1602 ignore differences that occur locally from county to county across the State of Illinois and remove a county board’s ability to regulate those local differences and address the concerns of their residents; and

WHEREAS, Senate Bill 1602 further undermines local control in that it substitutes state level legislative determination for the local control exercised by county zoning commissions, zoning boards of appeals, and county boards; and

WHEREAS, the County Board is the best entity to support the needs, interests, and safety of its residents due to direct feedback and understanding of the County’s needs, while State officials or industry leaders who do not reside in these Counties may not be aware of the most relevant and current information.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the members of the County Board of Kendall County, Illinois as follows:

1. The County Board opposes Senate Bill 1602 or any similar legislation that would undermine the County Board’s local zoning authority.
2. The County Board urges the Illinois General Assembly to abandon any efforts to advance Senate Bill 1602.
3. The County Board urges Governor Pritzker to veto Senate Bill 1602 or any similar bill should the General Assembly pass such legislation.
4. The Clerk is hereby directed to send copies of this Resolution to Governor Pritzker, the legislative leaders of both chambers of the Illinois General Assembly, and the representatives and senators representing this County.
