CALL TO ORDER

Chairman Jeff Wehrli called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m.

APPROVAL OF AGENDA

Member Flowers made a motion, seconded by Member Heiman, to approve the agenda as presented. With a voice vote of five (5) ayes, the motion carried.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Member Flowers made a motion, seconded by Member Heiman, to approve the minutes from the August 16, 2021. With a voice vote of five (5) ayes, the motion carried.

PUBLIC COMMENT

CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

Chairman Wehrli discussed the August meeting and the need to have future meetings with the other historic preservation organizations, including having more than one (1) meeting per year.

NEW BUSINESS

Follow-Up on August 2021 Meeting with Historic Preservation Groups

Commissioners reviewed the list of attendees. It was noted that some attendees did not sign the attendance sheet. Commissioners noted that organizations located outside the County also attended. Discussion occurred regarding including border municipalities in surveys when their townships are reviewed. Commissioners discussed scanning documents.

Discussion of 2022 Meeting with Historic Preservation Groups

Commissioners discussed a February meeting. The meeting would be either February 9th or February 16th. The Farnsworth House was the preferred choice with either February 9th or 16th. Topics of the meeting could include discuss the Farnsworth House, surveys (i.e. Ken Itle), and roundtable discussion. Save-the-date cards were usually sent right after the first of the year.

Discussion occurred regarding a summer picnic. Chairman Wehrli was working on it, but it turned into a political party event.

Discussion of October 7th and 8th Conference on Illinois History in Springfield; Commission Could Approve Paying a Maximum of \$90.00 Per Person to Attend the Conference

Mr. Asselmeier provided information on the event.

The consensus of the Commission was, while the topics sounded interesting, nothing applied to Kendall County.

Commissioners discussed grant writing. Kendall County does not have a dedicated grant writer when it comes to historic preservation. Ken Itle will help the County apply for the Certified Local Government Grant.

Discussion occurred regarding fire districts having practice fires on older buildings. Commissioners wanted to make sure historic items were removed from a property prior to demolition.

OLD BUSINESS

Discussion of Historic Survey Project

Mr. Asselmeier read an email from Jon Pressley stating that the grant window will open October 1st. He also noted that the Planning, Building and Zoning Committee was in favor of the project, contingent on the grant. The project is proposed in the capital budget.

Member Bernacki asked if WJE would be willing to do one (1) site. Mr. Asselmeier noted that WJE did work in Na-Au-Say Township. The Committee of the Whole has not requested additional information about the project. Mr. Asselmeier will request a sample sheet from Ken Itle.

Discussion of Cemeteries

There was no update on specific cemeteries. It was noted that the Kendall County Historical Society listed more cemeteries. Mr. Asselmeier will try to the Historical Society's information and check it against the County GIS.

PUBLIC COMMENT

Member Heiman discussed getting young people involved in historic preservation. Member Heiman will email Mr. Asselmeier the information.

Discussion occurred about protecting or moving the house across the alley from the County Office Building. Chairman Wherli explained how the normal process worked for a bid for a demolition. Lisa Wolancevich asked if there was a way to move the house; Lyon Farm may have the funds to move the house for a library. Discussion occurred regarding the logistics of moving the house. Member Flowers will discuss the matter with Brian DeBolt.

Lisa Wolancevich distributed information on the Kendall County Historical Society's Fall Festival and Car Show on September 25^{th} and 26^{th} .

ADJOURNMENT

Member Bernacki made a motion, seconded by Member Flowers, to adjourn. With a voice vote of five (5) ayes, the motion carried. The Historic Preservation Commission adjourned at 6:41 p.m.
