WHEREAS, Jacob M. Currey has previously been convicted of a number criminal and vehicle code offenses; and

WHEREAS, Jacob M. Currey was sentenced to a term in the Illinois Department of Corrections which he is presently serving; and

WHEREAS, while so incarcerated, Jacob M. Currey has filed numerous motions in his criminal cases and has also initiated several civil lawsuits against various individuals; and

WHEREAS, the civil lawsuits have all been dismissed due to the inability of Jacob M. Currey to follow and/or comply with the various requirements applicable to all litigants, whether self-represented or represented by counsel, in all civil matters as set forth in the Illinois Code of Civil Procedure, Illinois Supreme Court Rules, and the Local Rules of the 23<sup>rd</sup> Circuit Court.

IT IS ORDERED, that upon the Clerk of the Circuit Court receiving any additional civil filings from Jacob M. Currey, those documents are to be reviewed by the Presiding Judge, or in his absence, the Acting Presiding Judge, to determine whether the necessary documents for the filing of a new civil action, or any motions for hearing, are complete as submitted or require the submission of additional documents. This review is limited solely to the completion and submission

of all necessary and appropriate documentation to initiate a new civil case or the scheduling of any motions for hearing, and will not involve any determination as to the merits of any such filing. If the submission is incomplete, the Clerk of the Circuit Court will so notify Jacob M. Currey of what additional forms and/or documents are necessary to accept the documents for filing with the Clerk of the Circuit Court. Upon receipt of all necessary documents, appropriately prepared or completed by Jacob M. Currey, the Clerk of the Circuit Court shall file such documents in a pending matter, initiate a new case, and proceed as in all other civil filings. In the event that the appearance of Jacob M. Currey is necessary for any court date in a civil proceeding, the Clerk of the Circuit shall notify the assigned judge of the need of a Video Writ or Writ of Habeas Corpus (if appropriate) so that Jacob M. Currey may be present for said court proceeding. This administrative order does not apply to any criminal proceeding involving Jacob M. Currey.
