**WHEREAS**, subject to the overall administrative authority of the Illinois Supreme Court set forth in Supreme Court Rule 21 and pursuant to the specific authority granted by Local Rule 1.35, the assignment of cases within courtrooms in Kendall County is subject to the discretion of the Presiding Judge, and

**WHEREAS**, at the time new cases are filed, such cases are routinely assigned to the judge presiding over the court docket for that specific case type, and

**WHEREAS**, from time to time, certain judges have continuing or potential professional conflicts with the attorney filing such cases, which conflicts extend to other lawyers associated with that attorney's law firm, and

**WHEREAS**, in the interest of judicial economy, it is found to be more expedient to automatically reassign such cases upon filing rather than incurring the time delay associated with the process of recusal and/or remittal in open court.

**IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:**

1. Any new case filings initiated by the law firm of Kinnally Flaherty Krentz Loran Hodge & Masur P.C., which would routinely be assigned to the Honorable Stephen L. Krentz shall instead be assigned to the judge presiding in Courtroom 116.

2. Any new case filings initiated by the law firm of Krentz, Salfisberg, and Swanson-Haggard, PC which would routinely be assigned to the Honorable Stephen L. Krentz shall instead be assigned to the judge presiding in Courtroom 116.
3. Any new case filings initiated by the law firm of McAdams & Sartori, LLC which would routinely be assigned to the Honorable John F. McAdams shall instead be assigned to the judge presiding in Courtroom 111.
4. This Administrative Order shall only apply to cases filed on or after the date of this order.
5. This Administrative Order amends, supplements, and where inconsistent, supersedes Administrative Orders 21-02 and 21-11.
