<u>Job Summary:</u> Engineering Technicians will perform tasks related to the planning, design, and construction of highways and bridges, as well as asset management of roadway appurtenances such as, but not limited to, pavement markings, guardrail, lighting, traffic signals, and buried infrastructure.

## Essential Duties and Responsibilities - Specific tasks include, but are not limited to:

- Road and bridge construction project management and documentation
- Inspect and perform tests on construction materials, e.g., concrete testing
- Construction layout
- Ability to read and understand construction plans and specifications
- Prepare road and bridge contracts and specifications
- Coordinate road and bridge construction projects with township highway commissioners
- Manage the J.U.L.I.E. system for Kendall County Highway Department
- Perform routine maintenance and troubleshooting for traffic signal components and other electrical appurtenances
- Maintain a clean work environment in Department buildings and county-owned equipment
- Perform any other duties as required or assigned

## Education, Qualifications and License Requirements:

- Minimum of Associate of Science Degree, as well as good knowledge of the English language, spelling and grammar
- Familiarity with land surveying fundamentals or ability to obtain within 12 months
- Ability to speak effectively with supervisors, other employees, and the general public
- Understanding of documents such as SDS, equipment operating instructions, safety manuals & procedure manuals
- Knowledge of the materials, methods and practices used in highway and bridge construction
- Valid Illinois Driver's License

## Physical Requirements:

- Must have ability to lift and carry up to 50 lbs.
