Chairman Jeff Wehrli called the meeting to order at 6:01 p.m.

Member Shanahan made a motion, seconded by Member Heiman, to approve the agenda. With a voice vote of four (4) ayes, the motion carried.

NEW BUSINESS

Recommendation on FY2024-2025 Meeting Calendar

Mr. Asselmeier stated that in November the Historic Preservation meeting would be held at 6:00 p.m., because it is in the same fiscal year. The December meeting would start at 5:30 p.m. with the new fiscal year. Chairman Wehrli asked the Commission if they wanted the general meeting to start at 5:30 p.m. or at 6:00 p.m. Mr. Asselmeier stated that the winter meeting is in February. The summer meeting rotates between July and August. The Commission stated they would like the group meetings to be at 5:30 p.m.

Member Heiman made a motion, seconded by Member Shanahan, to recommend approval of the meeting calendar and the group meetings. With a voice vote of four (4) ayes, the motion carried.

Approval of a Recommendation to Authorize the County Board Chairman and Other Appropriate County Officials to Sign and Submit a Certified Local Government Grant to Conduct an Historic Structure Survey in Unincorporated Na-Au-Say and Seward Townships for a Total Project Cost of \$40,000 (Grant Amount is \$28,000 and County Match is \$12,000)

Mr. Asselmeier presented the quote from Wiss, Janney, Elstner Associates and the email from the State announcing the opening of the grant window. Mr. Asselmeier stated he is waiting for the paperwork to apply

for the grant. He said the application is basically formatted the same as it was for the project in Bristol and Kendall Townships.

Chairman Wehrli asked what the timeline is for applying for the grant. Mr. Asselmeier stated the application has to be submitted to the State by November 15, 2024.

Member Heiman made a motion, seconded by Member Bernacki, to recommend that the County Board Chairman and Other Appropriate County Officials sign and submit the grant application.

The votes were as follows:

The motion carried.

The proposal will go to the County Board on November 6, 2024.

Approval of Historic Preservation Award Application and Press Release

Commissioners reviewed the dates for the press release which will be on January 13, 2025, and February 14, 2025.

Chairman Wehrli stated he would like to have "adaptive reuse of a building" as one of the award designations. He requested Mr. Asselmeier to contact the Village of Oswego to get the status of the old Oswego Firehouse. The Vault in Yorkville and the winery on Plattville Road were also suggested as possible applicants for awards under the adaptive reuse category.

The application deadline is on February 28, 2025.

Member Heiman made a motion, seconded by Member Shanahan, to approve the application and press release. With a voice vote of four (4) ayes, the motion carried.

Discussion of 2025 Meeting with Historic Preservation Groups

Chairman Wehrli asked Commissioners to keep looking for a meeting place with the Historic Preservation Groups. The Historic Courthouse is default meeting location.

Discussion of 13860 Fox Road

Mr. Asselmeier stated he received an email from Anna Margaret Barris stating that her staff met with the roofing contractor in August but have not heard back with any estimates or that they were not interested. Ms. Barris said she would contact the secondary roofing contractor on her list. Ms. Barris also stated that they would not be able to let anyone in the house until the roof is completed and the interior has been cleaned up. The house has been vacant for fifteen (15) years. Ms. Barris will let Mr. Asselmeier know when the house will be available for a tour.

Discussion of Having Commission Meetings at Historic Locations in the County; Commission Could Determine Meeting Locations and Times

Member Shanahan spoke about The Plano Stone Church and will look into the possibility of having a future meeting at that location.

Wind Events and Glass Breakage: Lessons Learned in San Francisco



In March 2023, winter storms produced two significant wind events in San Francisco within a span of one week. Glass at several mid- and high-rise buildings fell to the street below, resulting in "shelter in place" directives and local media coverage. Additional storm-related glass breakage and other facade failures occurred but were not as widely publicized. Following WJE's investigation of these buildings, the City of San Francisco issued revisions to their Facade Inspection and Maintenance Program. Primarily affecting buildings fifteen stories and taller, these changes were intended to safeguard against future failures and have already led to the identification and repair of broken glass on other high-rises in the city.

In this complimentary, one-hour webinar, architects **Andrew Bishop** and **Aaron Weiss**, along with engineer **Kaat Ceder**, will discuss the failures observed in San Francisco, explain recent updates to the city's facade inspection and maintenance program, and offer practical recommendations for owners and facade designers—in San Francisco and beyond—based on their investigations.

 Identify common causes of glass breakage in high-rise glazing and clarify how facade inspectors can evaluate an "unsafe condition," as defined by the code
