### **Kendall County Sheriff's Office Investigating Home Invasion**

#### **\* UPDATE \***

The Kendall County State's Attorney's Office has approved charges against two Oswego men in connection with a Home Invasion investigation in the 0-100 block of Saugatuck Road, unincorporated Oswego Township.

Jesus Villegas, a 29 year-old man from the 600 block of Manhattan Circle in Oswego was charged with:

- Two counts of Home Invasion (class X felonies)
- Unlawful Use of Weapon by a Felon (class 2 felony)
- Possession of a Stolen Firearm (class 2 felony)
- He also had warrants for Possession of Cannabis (Kendall and DuPage Counties) and Possession of Controlled Substance (Kane County)

Adrian Villegas, a 26 year-old man from the 600 block of Manhattan Circle in Oswego was charged with:

- Two counts of Home Invasion (class X felonies)
- Possession of a Stolen Firearm (class 2 felony)

Both subjects remain in custody and will appear in bond call Saturday morning.

On July 12, 2019 at 6:45 am, The Kendall County Sheriff's Deputies along with Officers from Oswego Police Department, Montgomery Police Department, Kane County Sheriff's Office and

Aurora Police Department were dispatched to a Home Invasion in the 0-100 Block of Saugatuck Road, Boulder Hill subdivision, Montgomery IL.

After a thorough investigation the two suspects involved in this incident were apprehended and taken into custody. The suspects were then transported to the Kendall County Jail where they are waiting charges.

The Sheriff's Office continues to investigate this targeted incident and would like to express thanks to all of the officers that assisted. And a big thanks to all of the citizens for their valuable assistance and information which greatly assisted us with our efforts.
