WAGE DEDUCTION NOTICE

(Note: The Answer Date is the date by which the employer must file answers to the Judgment Creditors Interrogatories. This date is not a scheduled court appearance. Do not appear in Court on this date.)

The Court will be asked to issue a wage deduction summons against the employer named above for wages due or about to become due to the Judgment Debtor. The wage deduction summons will be issued on the basis of a judgment against the Judgment Debtor in favor of the Judgment Creditor in the amount stated above.

- The amount of wages that may be deducted is limited by federal and Illinois law:
1. Under Illinois law, the amount of wages that may be deducted is limited to the lessor of (i) 15% of gross weekly wages or (ii) the amount by which disposable earnings for a week exceed the total of 45 times the federal minimum hourly wage.
 2. Under federal law, the amount of wages that may be deducted is limited to the lessor of (i) 25% of disposable earnings for a week or (ii) the amount by which disposable earnings for a week exceed 30 times the federal minimum hourly wage.
 3. Pension and retirement benefits and refunds may be claimed as exempt from wage deduction under Illinois law.
 4. You may be entitled to certain exemptions for personal and real property under state or federal law. These exceptions may protect your property or restrict the rights of the plaintiff to recover your property in this proceeding. It is your obligation to prove you are entitled to any exemption and you may wish to obtain legal advice before appearing in court.

You have the right to request a hearing before the court date to dispute the wage deduction because the wages are exempt. To obtain a hearing you, the Judgment Debtor, must notify the Clerk of the Circuit Court in writing at 807 W. John St. Yorkville, IL 60560 on or before the return date specified above. The Clerk of the Circuit Court will provide a hearing date and the necessary forms that must be prepared by you or your attorney, and send to the Judgment Creditor and the employer, or their attorney, regarding the time and location of the hearing. This notice may be sent by regular first class mail.

I certify that before causing the wage deduction summons to issue I personally delivered or sent by first class mail to the Judgment Debtor a Wage Deduction Notice at the Judgment Debtor's last known address.
