Priority Project Updates

Forest Foundation Updates

Fall Fest was a resounding success. Over 800 individuals attended. Highlights included presentations from Tony the Bug Whisperer, Hoo Haven Wildlife Rehabilitation, and planting the Hoover Nature Play Space butterfly garden. The Foundation plans to take a break from offering Fall Fest in 2017.

Prescription Burns

The District is partnering with the NRCS to support a prescribed burn at Millbrook North Forest Preserve within the NRCS easement area. The burn will take place, weather permitting, sometime in late October – mid-November.

The District also plans to assist Bedrock Landscaping with a controlled burn of Schessler's Fen, and Bryon Walters, Illinois Natural Areas Improvements with a controlled burn of Tucker-Millington Fen. Additional training burns will be scheduled and completed weather permitting.

Sunrise Center North – 5K and Family Fun Day

Efforts are underway to plan and secure additional sponsors for the 5K and Family Fun Day at Ellis House and Equestrian Center scheduled for Saturday, October 29, 2016. \$1,200 in sponsorships has been secured to date from partnering agency efforts.

Stephanie's Garden / Hoover Nature Play Space Updates

Phase 1a is now complete. Project expenses are in line with the budget thanks to additional support received from past fundraising efforts of Natural Beginnings parents. A donor's opening will be held at Hoover Forest Preserve this Saturday, October 15, 2016 from noon to 1pm, followed by a volunteer appreciation picnic at the home of Foundation Trustee Scott Parkhurst.

The District's initial meeting with AquaScapes was well received. As part of the outcomes from the meeting, the District needs to determine water pressure and flow volume from the extended service line in order to move forward with the project design work for the next phase of the project.

The Hoover Nature Play Space received recertification through https://natureexplore.org/, a collaborative program of the Arbor Day Foundation and Dimensions Educational Research Foundation.

Preliminary Operating and Capital Budgets

Development of the FY 16-17 operating and capital budgets have been completed.

Highlights include an increase in the projected operating surplus for the year, and consideration of a new part time position to assist with natural areas management activities in all preserve areas.

Capital project implementation schedules will continue to be impacted pending State of Illinois reimbursement of LWCF grant funds for the Fox River Bluffs acquisition, with current funding availability limited to completion of the proposed expansion of Maramech Forest Preserve lands, and the repair or demolition of Millbrook Bridge.

OSLAD/LWCF Project Presentation

The IDNR has scheduled acquisition grant project presentations for Monday, October 24, 2016. Two District representatives are invited to attend. Seven grant project requests were submitted requesting a total of \$4.2 million in LWCF assistance.

Cliff Oleson Retirement & New Hires

The District has received notice that Cliff Oleson will be retiring from District service effective November 1, 2016. A Grounds Maintenance position opening will be posted by next week.

The Environmental Education department has hired three new part time Environmental Education Instructors including Rebecca Warren, Melinda McGraw-Carpenter, and Kimberly Adams.

Responsibilities:
